### STUDY ABROAD NOTES:

**For most ENG and ENG/ED majors the only time to study abroad is FALL SEMESTER OF JUNIOR YEAR.**

#### Exceptions:

- Some students study abroad during short-term faculty-led programs (Winter or Summer)
- Some students study abroad in their sophomore year.

#### Why?

- Senior Thesis I (ENG 480) is ONLY offered Spring of your junior year (so you can't study abroad this semester).
- Senior Thesis II is ONLY offered Fall of your senior year (so you can't study abroad this semester)
- Student Teaching = Spring Semester senior year (unless you do student teaching abroad, you can't study abroad this semester)

**We highly recommend the London Theatre program in the Fall of your junior year, but there are many wonderful other options. Afraid it might be too expensive? Sometimes it's LESS expensive. *Hie ye hence to the Study Abroad Office to talk about your options.***
